

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# LABVERDE SPECULATIVE ECOLOGIES RESIDENCY

NOVEMBER, 2025



## **PRESENTATION**

LABVERDE was created to strengthen the limits of art through a broad array of experiences, knowledge sets and cultural perspectives involving art, traditional knowledge, sciences and nature. The program's main goal is to promote artistic creation through a constructive debate about environmental issues supported by theory, data and life experiences in the Amazon rainforest.

In this sense LABVERDE's artistic program functions as a multidisciplinary platform for the development of critical thinking about nature and ecology. Artists, activists, indigenous, scientists and other agents of knowledge come together to recognize and narrate nature, in an attempt to create new ways of existing and interacting with the natural environment, as well as to speculate on possible futures for the Amazon.

LIFE EXPERIENCE AND THEORY WILL BE INTEGRATED INTO 10 DAYS OF INTENSIVE ACTIVITIES IN THE FOREST. A SCHEDULE OF EXPEDITIONS, LECTURES, WORKSHOPS, PRESENTATIONS AND SEMINARS WILL ENHANCE CREATIVITY, HAVING NATURE AS A COMMON GROUND.

Transdisciplinary content and life experience will foster an analytical and critical perspective of issues such as landscape interpretation, interspecies dynamics, anthropogenic impacts, and the role of art in engaging social-ecological behavior. Together we will reflect about:

WHAT CAN WE LEARN FROM TRADITIONAL KNOWLEDGE ABOUT SUSTAINABLE MODELS OF COEXISTENCE? HOW DOES CULTURE CONTRIBUTE TO SPOTLIGHT IDEAS TO POSTPONE THE END OF NATURE? HOW DOES YOUR ART AFFECT THE ENVIRONMENT AND ITS LIFE? WHAT DOES SCIENCE HAVE TO SAY ABOUT THE BIGGEST FOREST IN THE WORLD?

The program is designed to support artists interested in delving deeper into environmental issues, whose artistic research is focused on nature and environmental crises. After the program, artists will be able to improve their own creative content, have access to specialists from many different fields and be part of an international network focused on environmental justice.

PROGRAM IS TARGETED TOWARDS VISUAL ARTISTS, MUSICIANS, DANCERS, WRITERS, DESIGNERS, FASHION DESIGNERS AND ALL CREATIVES ARE WELCOME TO APPLY

Content main goal is to reflect on the role of culture for environmental justice, articulating dimensions such as sustainability, climate socio-biodiversity, innovation and culture. From a transdisciplinary perspective and a pedagogical approach, it puts artistic, scientific and indigenous peoples, in parallel with the COP-30 discussions, to be held in Brazil in 2025

Duo artists are welcome to apply. Due to our limited spots available, collective of artists can apply, but only the representative responsible for the group will be able to join the program.

## **METODOLOGY**

We hope the network and training process will serve as the basis for artistic research that may be developed and shared after the program. Although the program does not necessarily carring on to a physical production, there will be project presentations and group discussion, in which the specificities of each artist will be contextualized. We understand the experience as the artistic production summit and the works, publications and exhibitions as process surplus.

This will be the 13th edition of Speculative Ecologies, a program that uses a innovative methodology for social engagement with life. Our social technology has been extensively tested and is based on three pillars: activation of consciousness with talks by experts, sensory expansion in the field and performances and artistic interventions.

## LOCATION

The journey will take place in different locations enabling different scales and perspectives of the Amazon rainforest. Program will be developed near the city of Manaus, exploring ecological reserves, communities, different ecosystems and impacted zones by the Anthropocene. Part of the residency will be held inside of the rainforest in a research scientific headquarter and part will be held in a Regional Boat, to access coastal communities and aquatic ecosystems.



## **PROGRAM**

The program's main focus is to promote artistic creation through a constructive debate about environmental issues generated by theory, data and life experiences in the Amazon rainforest.

Expeditions: site visits mediated by labverde's advisors

Talks: 40 hours of talks, meetings, lectures and workshops with local and international specialists.

Artistic Interventions: development and presentation of the artistic projects, performances and workshops.

All activities will be held in english, with simultaneous translations when necessary.

## PROGRAM ORGANIZERS

Speculative Ecologies is developed in a collaboration between LABVERDE and The National Institute of Amazonian Research (INPA) and is supported by a mix of partner's institutions, artists and international grants.

LABVERDE is a non-profit internationally award-winning association based in the Amazon Brazil dedicated to the development of artistic languages about the environment. Created in 2013 by local professionals, produce and democratize knowledge by organizing artistic residencies, lectures, exhibitions, festivals, workshops and publications.

THE NATIONAL INSTITUTION OF AMAZONIAN RESEARCH (INPA) is a world reference in Tropical Biology, responsible for conducting researches, surveys and inventories of fauna and flora, and investigating the sustainable use of natural resources in the Amazon.

## TERMS OF PAYMENT

Program fee costs **USD \$4600** for international artists and **R\$ 18.000** for Brazilians artists and includes expeditions, lectures, accommodation, meals and transfer during the period of 10 days.

## **GRANTS**

Labverde grant waives the program fee for participants. Our grant policy is aimed to democratize the program access between artists from countries without cultural financial aid. Only artists from the Global South are welcome to apply. To apply for a grant, candidates should include a motivation letter in the attached documents.
